

TIPS FOR READING SUCCESS

Use the **RUNNERS** process for testing success.
Otherwise, use these simple steps to increase your comprehension of texts.

BEFORE READING

- Examine front and back covers of section or book
- Read the title and any subtitles
- Examine the illustrations
- Examine the print or font for changes
- Examine the form and type of text

DURING READING: **ANNOTATE!**

Mark in the text:

- underline/highlight = important
- * = worth readdressing
- ? = don't understand
- ☺ = I agree/like this
- ☹ = I don't agree/don't like this
- ~~~~~ = vocabulary
- Circle it = who/what
- Box it = when/where info

Write in the margins:

- Paraphrase/Summarize
- Make predictions
- Formulate opinions
- Make connections
- Ask questions
- Analyze the author's craft
- Write reflections, reactions, or comments
- Look for patterns/repetition

AFTER READING

- Reread annotations – draw conclusions
- Rereading introduction and conclusion – try to figure out something new
- Examine patterns/repetition – determine possible meanings
- Determine meaning behind title

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RUNNERS

R—Read the title (and introduction statements) and predict what the selection will be about. Read the questions **FIRST**.

U—Underline important key words in the questions.

N—Number the paragraphs.

N—Now read the entire selection and as you read...

E—Encircle key words and annotate the text to find what may relate or help find answers.

R—Read the questions again and eliminate incorrect responses.

S—Select the best answer. Make sure your answer is correct!

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
